9/11 Memorial Ceremony

To commemorate the 10-year anniversary of September 11 terrorist attacks on our nation, Chula Vista Fire and Police Departments are holding "A Decade of Remembrance" memorial ceremony. Open to the public, the event is supported by the Otay Ranch Town Center, South Bay YMCA, the Olympic Training Center, U.S. Border Patrol, U.S. Navy and the U.S. Army.

Held at the Otay Ranch Town Center, the day begins at 8:30 a.m. with a free family one-mile run/walk (registration at 8 a.m.). The memorial ceremony is scheduled for 9 a.m., followed by a pancake breakfast at 9:30 a.m. From 10 a.m. to noon there will be demonstrations by fire, police, and military along with jumpy-jumps and face painting for children. Plan to attend on **Sunday, September 11!**
