



**Second Lieutenant Arthur Johnson** completed U.S. Army Air Force Training at Williams Field, Chandler, Arizona on January 16, 1944. He was born March 27, 1924 in San Francisco, California. His parents were William Ogden Johnson of Arizona and Lee Cabell of Missouri. At the time of his birth his parents address was 3351 29<sup>th</sup> St. San Francisco.

2LT Johnson was killed August 3, 1944 while a passenger on a C-47 USAAF aircraft. The crew, a flight surgeon and all passengers were killed in the mishap. The passengers were the entire class of P-47 Jug pilots that Lieutenant Johnson had graduated with.

At the time of his death his mothers address in San Diego was listed as 3351 Twenty-ninth Street, San Diego, California.

Second Lieutenant Johnson is buried at the Ft. Rosecrans National Cemetery. His tombstone is located in Section OSA Grave #6, Row O.
