USE AGREEMENT

CONDITIONS

1. When attributing images to the library source, credit line should read: "Courtesy of Chula Vista Public Library, Local History Collection."
2. Permission is granted for one-time use only. Photographic material may not be reproduced or redistributed in any form without written permission of the Chula Vista Public Library.
3. The Chula Vista Public Library does not claim to control the rights of reproduction for all photographic materials in all its collections. The signee assumes all responsibility for clearing reproduction rights and for any infringement of the U.S. Copyright Law.
4. Requests are processed in the order received and will be available in approximately 3-4 weeks. Photographs are provided by the library in digital format delivered by email or on a CD which can be picked up at the Civic Center branch.
