Seniors

- San Diego Food Bank's [Senior Food Program](#) is a federal program that provides monthly supplemental food packages to income-eligible senior citizens ages 60 and over. USDA-provided food is provided at [distribution sites](#) every month, throughout San Diego County. To verify eligibility, visit the [Food Bank's website](#), or call 1-866-350-3663.
- County of San Diego [Aging & Independence Services](#) contracts with community organizations to provide pick-up meals for older adults 60 and over during COVID-19. Some of the sites are providing home delivery. [List of meal providers](#).
- [Meals on Wheels](#) - eligibility is 60+ years of age, caretakers of seniors 60+ years of age, disabled veterans of any age.
- [Jewish Family Services](#) - This service is available to seniors and younger adults with disabilities or health conditions that prevent them from leaving their home. Contact: (858) 637-3210.
